

# The City of Los Angeles is getting to work on Riverside Drive

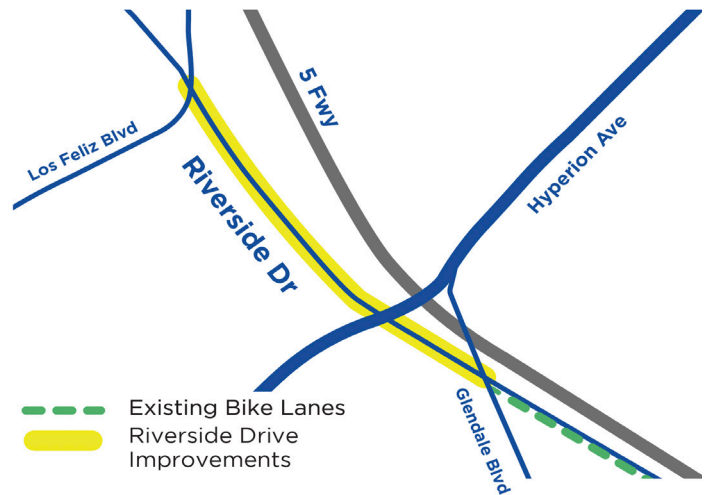
Glendale Blvd - Los Feliz Blvd

## PROJECT SUMMARY

The City of Los Angeles is making improvements to Riverside Drive from Glendale Blvd. to Los Feliz Blvd. In coordination with scheduled street repaving, the Department of Transportation (LADOT) proposes to implement street safety improvements, including fresh paint, upgraded high-visibility crosswalks, and repurposing one northbound travel lane to calm traffic and create space for new bike lanes in each direction. This will connect existing Riverside Dr. bike lanes to Griffith Park, community open spaces, and the LA River.



## PROJECT GOALS

- Improve safety for everyone
- Encourage safer speeds on Riverside Dr.
- Expand mobility options to Griffith Park, the LA River and local destinations
- Close the gap in the local bicycle network
- Create a more livable street on Riverside Dr

## PROJECT TIMELINE

- Community Engagement: Nov 2021 - Jan 2021
- Street Repaving: Jan 2022
- Project Installation: Feb 2022

## WHAT'S CHANGING?

- StreetsLA will repave Riverside Drive between Glendale Blvd. and Los Feliz Blvd.
- LADOT will install fresh paint and pavement markings, including upgraded crosswalks.
- The project will repurpose one (1) vehicle travel lane in the northbound direction only.
- A new parking-protected bike lane will be added on both sides of Riverside Dr., connecting with existing bike lanes south of Glendale Blvd.
- The project may involve minor changes to parking for safety and visibility.
