



DO YOU KNOW THESE STREET SIGNS?

What are the things that make our neighborhood streets safer for walking and rolling? Learn to identify signs and signals that you might see on your walk to school, and how they make walking and rolling safer and easier.



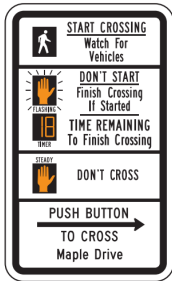
FLASHING HAND

If flashing, don't start to cross. If you are in the street, continue to the other side.



WALK PERSON

Ok to walk and roll across the street. Always look for cars to make sure it's safe!



TRAFFIC SIGNAL PUSH BUTTON

Push this button to change the traffic signal so you can cross the street safely.



SCHOOL CROSSING SIGN

Warns drivers that people may be crossing the street near a school.



NO PEDESTRIAN CROSSING

Don't cross the street. It's dangerous to cross in areas where there are no marked crosswalks.



YIELD

Drivers must prepare to stop in presence of other drivers and/or people prepared to cross the street.



STRIPED CROSSWALK

A crosswalk with wide stripes makes street crossing areas more visible to people driving so they can stop for you to cross.



TRAFFIC SIGNAL

Traffic signals tell people driving to stop so that you can cross the street safely.

WALK, BIKE, AND ROLL

BINGO

Look for these street and safety items as you explore your neighborhood and walk or roll to school.
