

How to Use the New Street Design

Bus Priority Lanes & Protected Bike Lanes - National Blvd to Tilden Ave

Venice Boulevard Safety and Mobility Project

The City of Los Angeles and Metro are upgrading mobility on Venice Blvd from Lincoln Blvd to National Blvd. This project aims to improve comfort and safety for all who travel on Venice Blvd. by improving the existing bike lane, dedicating a lane for faster and more reliable bus service, and adding safety features throughout the corridor.

Wait for your bus

Wait for your bus on the sidewalk at the transit stop.

During Phase 1 of this project, your bus will continue to pull up to the curb to pick up and drop off passengers. crossing pedestrians.

Park/Load

Park in marked areas to the right of the bus priority lane. Do not park, load, or drop off/ pick up passengers in the bicycle lane or bus priority lane. Use the striped buffer zone to access vehicles. Look for passing buses and bikes when opening car doors and crossing the bicycle lane.

**Only where signs permit. Refer to signage for restrictions.*

Drive

Stay in travel lane. Do not drive in parking lane or bicycle lane. Do not drive in bus priority lane unless you are approaching the intersection to make a right turn. Watch for bicyclists when making left turns.

Make a Right Turn

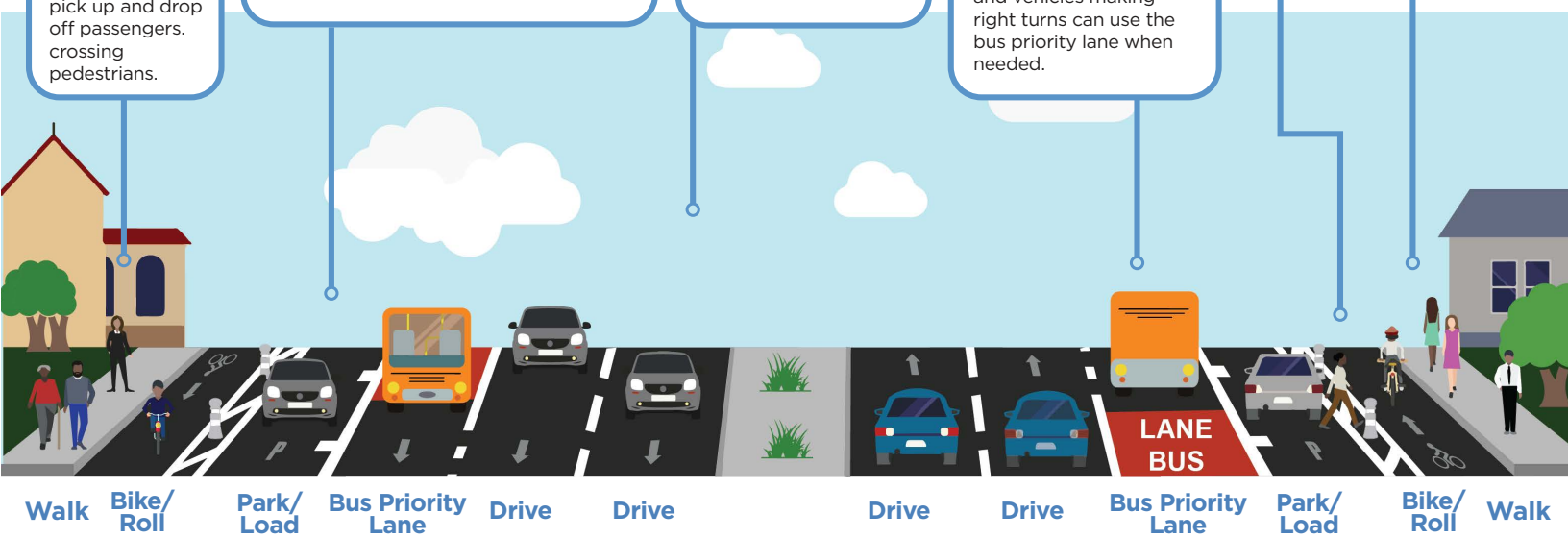
Vehicles are permitted to enter the bus priority lanes to make legal right turns at intersections and driveways. Do not park, load, unload, or drop off/pick up passengers in the bus priority lanes at any time. Emergency vehicles and vehicles making right turns can use the bus priority lane when needed.

Bike/Roll

Ride in the new bicycle lanes, and watch for crossing pedestrians.

Walk

Look for oncoming bicyclists when crossing bicycle lanes.
